Arizona voters say federal education spending too low, and not hearing enough from Senate candidates on education

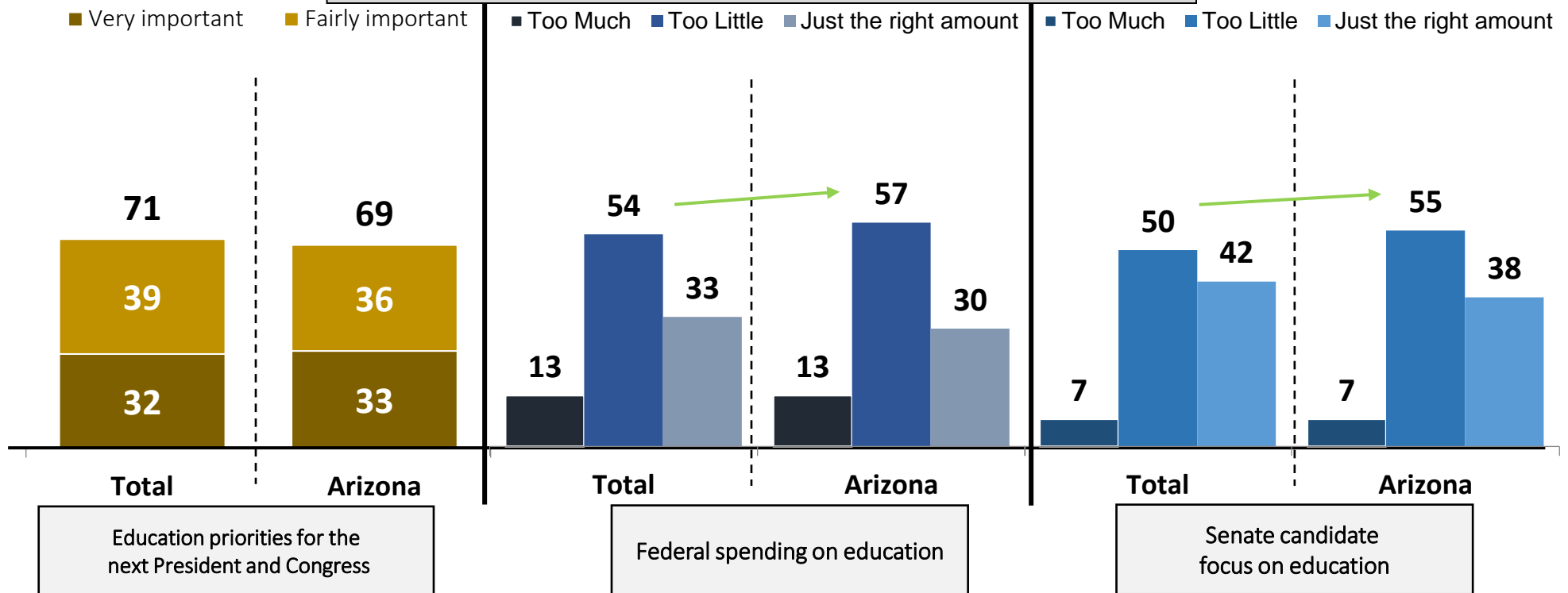
How important do you think it should be for the next President and Congress to make education a top national priority?

BATTLEGROUND VS. ARIZONA COMPARISON

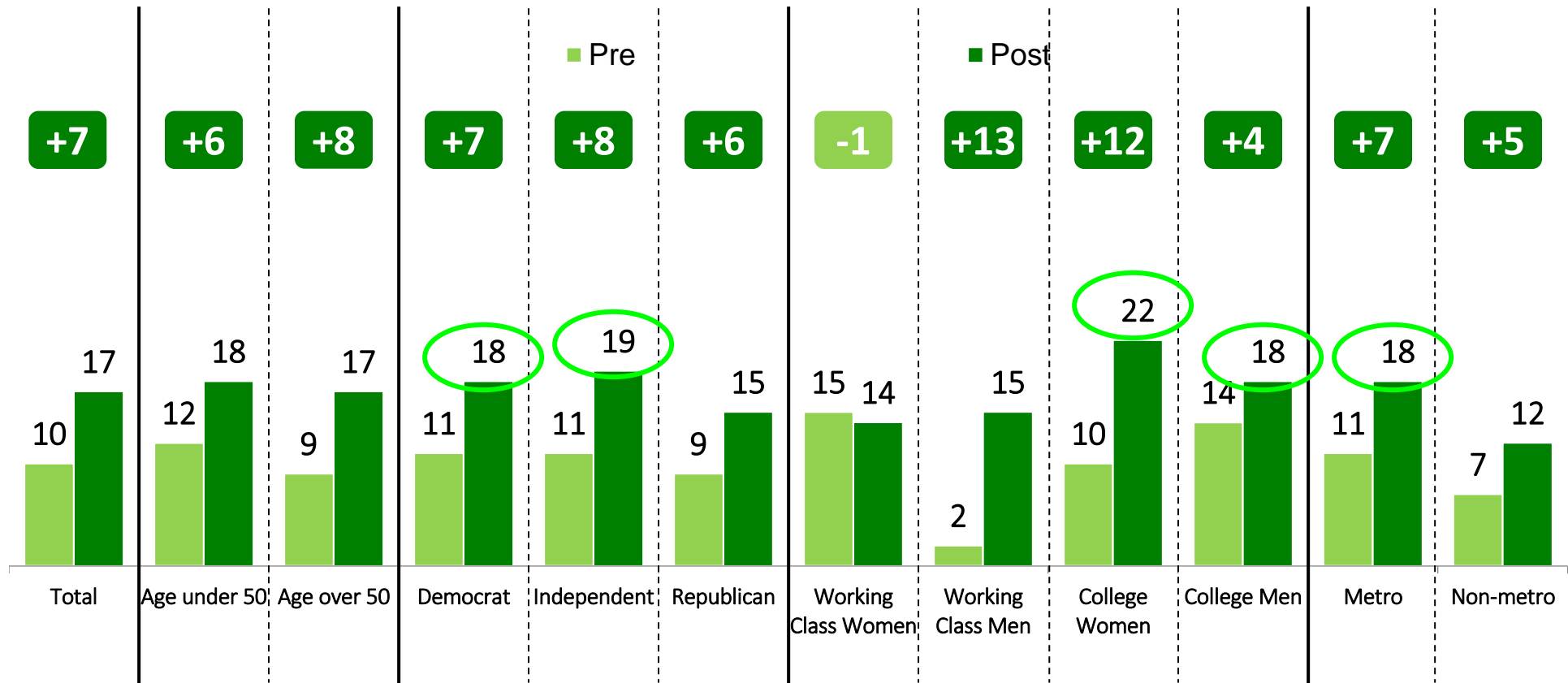


Strong shift among Democrats and Independents on education. Potential reaches across class, but strongest with college grads and in the cities.

INITIAL TO FINAL SHIFT ON EDUCATION



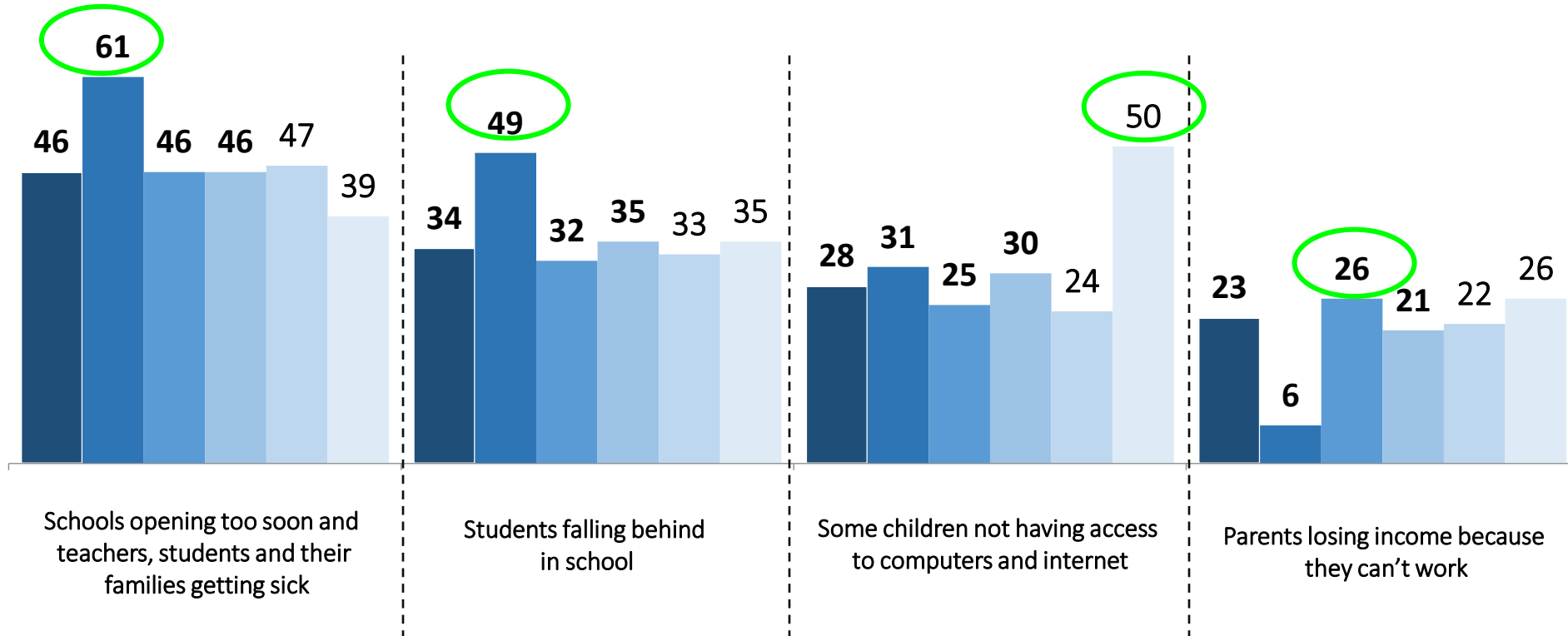
Safety and students falling behind are top of mind, especially for voters of color. Huge concern over access to internet and computers is in rural areas.

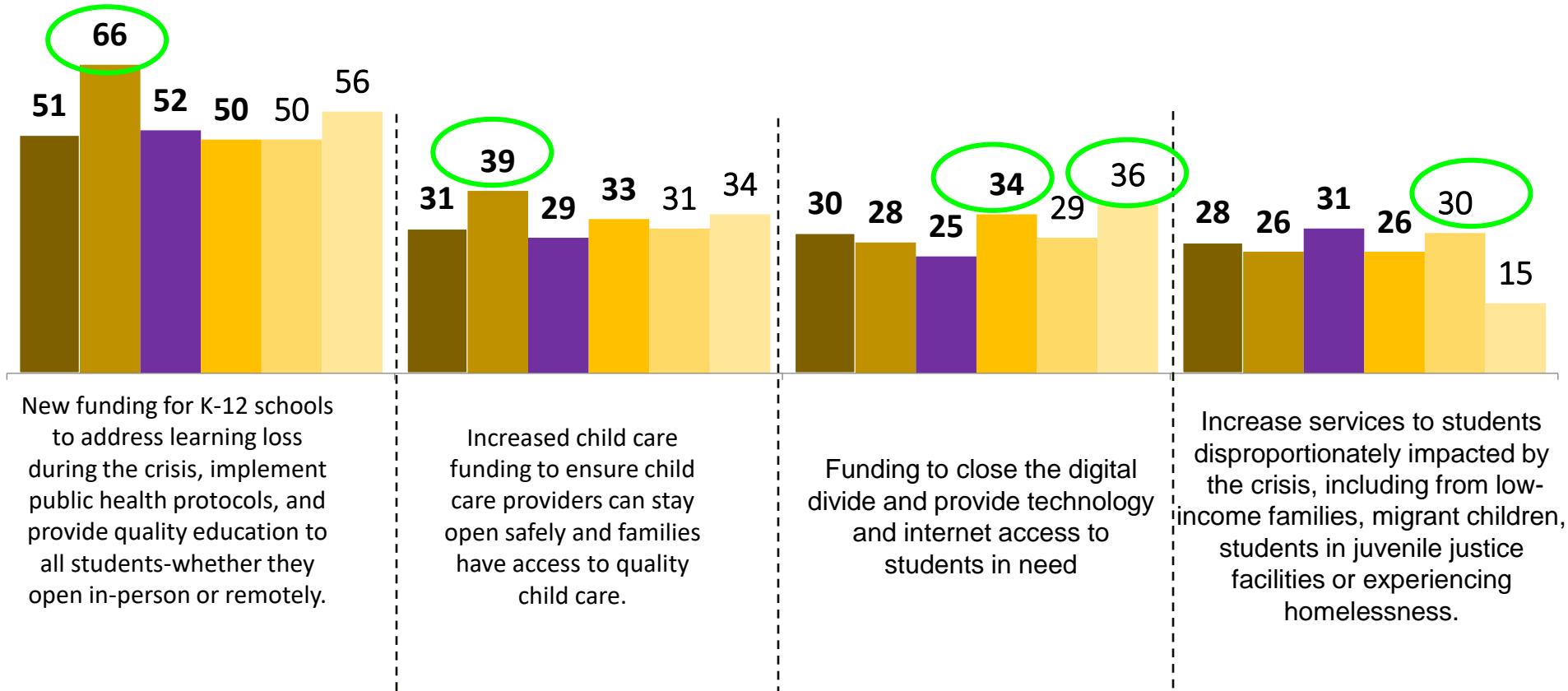
Safety and access to childcare are top concerns for voters of color. Closing digital divide is particularly important to working class and rural voters.

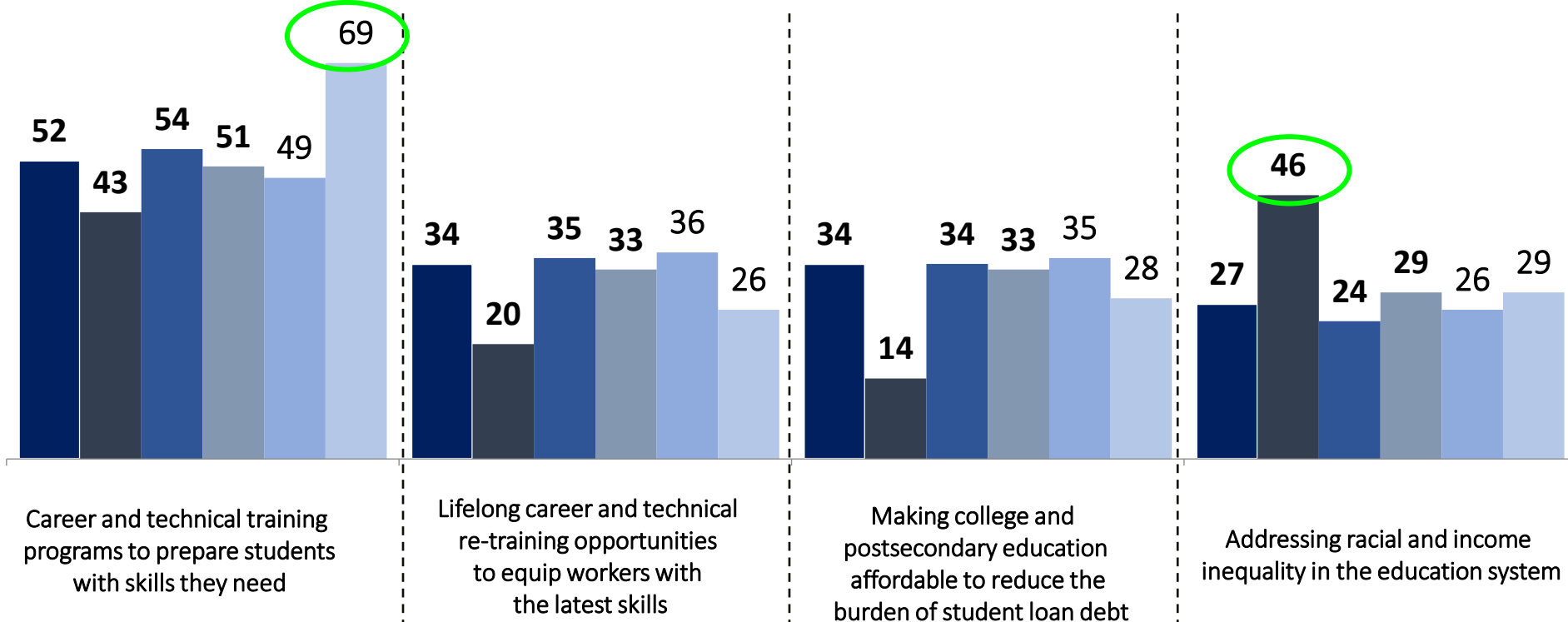
Career and technical education for kids hugely important for voters outside of cities, addressing racial and income inequality important to voters of color

Major divide between urban and rural areas on redesigning k-12 versus reforms focused on jobs and infrastructure

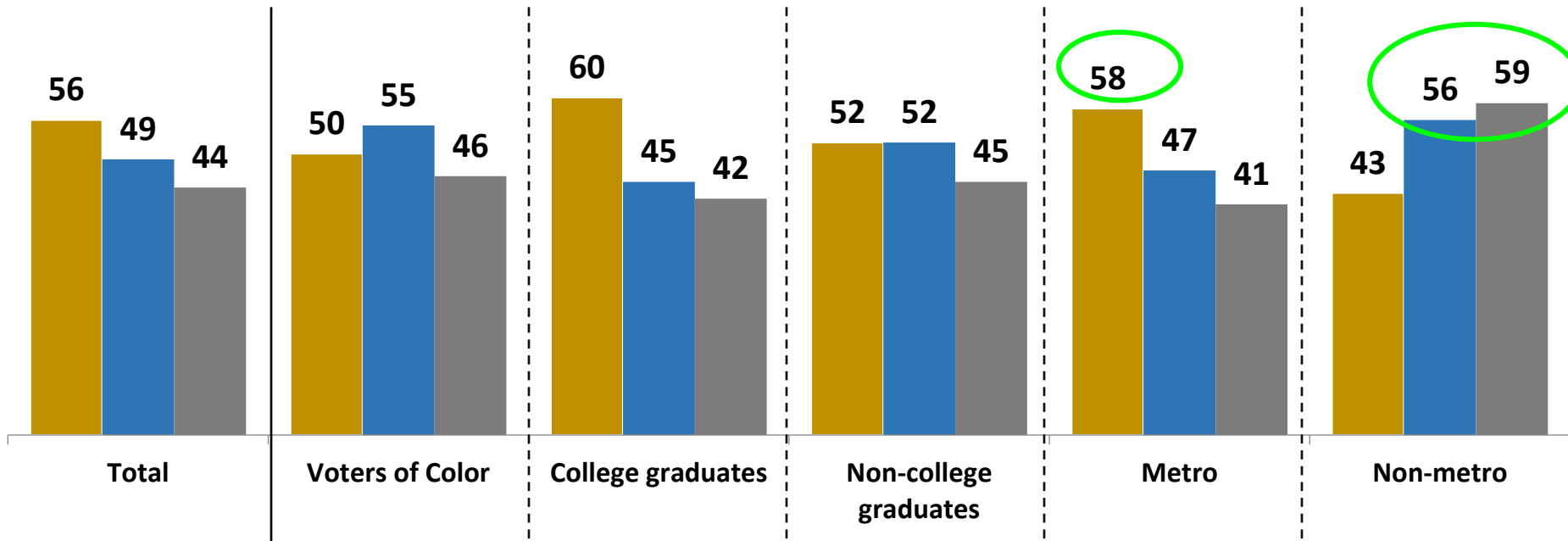
Let's say you wanted America to improve its current economic, healthcare and overcome national polarization through big changes in the education system. Which THREE of the proposals below would you choose?

BIG EDUCATION IDEAS

Recognize that this is the highest unemployment rate on record, and use this opportunity to retrain America for the future. And just like the Congress did for returning GIs in WWII, create a massive retraining program for the 52 million unemployed or 30 million collecting benefits

Expand affordable internet access to all Americans to the necessary education and training materials and services including, and provide appropriate hardware and software as needed, so that people have access to the learning, training and services they need throughout their lives.
